PERMANENT MINISTRY DIRECTIVE

No. 29/2005

SUBJECT: Ministry policy to develop criteria for the payment of rewards for the capture or death in combat of leaders of illegal armed organizations, of their military, management, or communications equipment, and of information regarding activities related to drug trafficking, as well as payment for information that supports the continuation of intelligence activities and planning of operations.

1. GOAL AND SCOPE

a. Purpose

Define a ministry policy developing clear and definite criteria for the payment of rewards for the capture or death in combat of leaders of illegal armed organizations, of their military, management, or communications equipment, and of information that supports the continuation of intelligence activities and planning of operations.

b. Specific Objectives

i) Define payments for information and payment of rewards.

ii) Fix criteria for establishing values in order to pay rewards for the principal leaders of the illegal armed organizations and the drug trafficking leaders, in a manner that will reduce incentives for terrorism and other crimes, such as kidnapping.

iii) Establish clear and predetermined amounts for reward payments for military, management or communications equipment, or activities related to drug trafficking.

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- iv) Define a mechanism for prioritizing the adherents of the illegal armed organizations, by classifying them by levels.
- v) Define the common documents that confirm the operational results for the payment of rewards.
- vi) Establish a procedural flow chart that is consistent for all of the Armed Forces for payments for information and for reward payments.
- vii) Create a Technical Committee charged with following up on the objectives stated in this Directive.

c. References

- i) Directive 018/98 MDN-SEG-252, establishing a system of reward payments for the capture of leaders of illegal organizations.
- ii) Resolution 04844/99 of the Comptroller General of the Republic (fiscal control of secret payments)
- iii) Policies of the Ministry of National Defense.

d. Effect

- i) In effect after the date of publication and repealing the provisions contained in Directive No. 20, 2005, and any other contradictory regulation.

2. PAYMENT FOR INFORMATION AND PAYMENT OF REWARDS

a. Payment of Rewards

Payment in money or in kind, as previously established by the national government, to any person for timely and truthful information furnished to the Armed Forces, if the information leads to the capture or death in combat of leaders of the illegal armed organizations or leaders in drug trafficking, regarding the location of military, management, or communication equipment or information about activities related to drug trafficking. Such information must also, after inspection, analysis, comparison, evaluation and dissemination and operational planning, generate positive results or permit the contravention of criminal actions.

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The amount of money or benefits to be received by the source will depend on the quality, utility and impact of the operational results obtained. The criterion for valuation of the reward will be based on the valuation criteria established in this directive.

b. Payments for information.

Payment in money or in kind to an individual for furnishing information of interest for intelligence activities, counterintelligence, and criminal investigation, with respect to criminal activities that affect security and stability in any region of the country. Information about criminal activity, location of cells, supplies, weapons, and equipment of organizations and/or persons acting illegally in specified locations, if the information serves as a foundation for the continuation of intelligence activities and subsequent planning of operations.

This information might lead to occasional trustworthy elements which, in spite of the registration, analysis, comparison and evaluation, do not always lead to positive results, since on some occasions, they are the continuation of information furnished earlier, and may subsequently lead to positive results.

3. CRITERIA FOR THE VALUATION OF REWARD PAYMENTS FOR LEADERS OF ILLEGAL ARMED ORGANIZATIONS AND LEADERS OF DRUG TRAFFICKING.

The valuation criteria necessary to establish reward levels will be defined by the following aspects, in order of priority, so that every criterion corresponds to a reward level.

4. MILITARY, MANAGEMENT, OR COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT AND ACTIVITIES RELATED TO DRUG TRAFFICKING

Payment for information to the person who leads to the discovery of military, management, or communication equipment or any other item that aids the illegal armed groups in their illicit activities, is established according to the following table:

5. PAYMENTS FOR DELIVERY OF INFORMATION.

For the purpose of this directive, payment for information is understood as defined in paragraph b of section 2 of this directive.

Those charged with making secret payments have the authority to negotiate with the human source, according to the individual factors related to the information furnished and according to the accomplishment of strategic plans, neutralization of criminal actions and political, social, economic effects, and government policies.

6. NECESSARY DOCUMENTS.

These are the documents that, at minimum, need to be included in support of reward payments determined in sections 3 and 4 of this directive.

- a. An official document that governs an operation by a tactical or operational unit and the patrol or outcome report. This document may be replaced by a certification signed by the commander of the unit, making a record of the carrying out of the operation, of the results obtained and stating that its success was based on the intelligence information furnished by the source.
- b. The certificate or internal document proving the capture of material that will be made available to the competent authorities, or a certificate that records the destruction or confiscation of the object, according to what happened. (The result must accord with Sections 3 and 4 of this directive.)
- c. A photograph, code key or official letter used by the military unit to inform superiors of the results obtained.

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- d. In cases where the results include a capture or death in combat, the attachment of related documents with a verification list for each individual reported is obligatory. Failure to include any of these must include a reasonable justification in a separate attachment in order for a reward payment to be considered.
- e. There shall be a simplified organization chart created, wherein persons captured or killed in combat are located in the criminal structure. The chart shall be constructed whenever necessary, with information collected in advance, subsequently, or with hypothetical information furnished by intelligence and/or counterintelligence, as well as the criminal records of the individuals reported captured or killed.
- f. There shall be a memo to the Central Committee of the respective agency, informing of the results. The memo shall include the photographic and/or film record and eventually the record produced through communications media.
- g. The Committee shall study and evaluate the results, the operational context, as well as inspect and verify the supporting documentation, in order to negotiate the reward payments when the file is complete.
- h. Certification of the respective Central Committee, approving the reward payment. The certification shall clearly identify the two officials who act as witnesses for the reward payment.

7. FLOW CHART

This directive shall be included as Attachment B.

8. TECHNICAL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

The Committee will be directed by an adviser designated by the Minister of National Defense, and will consist of a delegate from the Administrative Division, an analyst from the J-2 of the Commanding General of the Armed Forces, the chief of the administrative division of the Army Intelligence Office, an analyst agreed-upon in order to resolve disputes, the chief of the administrative division of the JINA (Spanish acronym) of the Army, an analyst agreed-upon in order to resolve disputes, the chief of the administrative division of the JIN (Spanish acronym) of the Colombian Air Force, an analyst agreed-upon in order to resolve disputes, two officials from the National Police (DIPOL-DIJIN) (Spanish acronyms) an analyst from the (DAS) (Spanish acronym) and an analyst from the Technical Investigation Office of the Public Prosecutor's Office.

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The Committee will have the following responsibilities:

- a. Meet monthly or as necessary to evaluate the development and effect of this directive. At such meetings the delegates from each military branch or agency will provide information related to the leaders captured or killed in combat, illegal plantings detected and eradicated, and the amounts of reward or payments for information that were considered during the past month. The information provided will be incorporated in an action report for the MDN (Spanish acronym), the Commanding General of the Armed Forces, the Force Commanders, the Director of the National Police, and the Directors of the Intelligence Agencies.
- b. Identify the members of illegal armed groups in levels i and ii as established in Section 2 of this directive.
- c. Prepare a list of secondary priorities for those members who appear to be possible replacements in the list of those captured or killed in combat. This list shall be furnished to all the intelligence agencies of the Armed Forces and of the DAS so that this directive is continuously up-dated.
- d. Provide for the communication of the rewards program and the procedures for furnishing information.
- e. Incorporated the changes in the list of leaders of illegal armed groups, as the President of the Republic and/or the Minister of Defense may determine.
- f. Invite advisers to relevant regular or special meetings of the Committee, in order to improve its operations and when there is a particular subject that may require the opinion of an outside expert.
- g. Review and approve, through the Combined Intelligence Board, the rewards or payments for information that exceed the legal maximum set by the directors of national intelligence agencies, acting as managers of the expenditures.
- h. Review and approve the leaders of the illegal armed groups who have been classified in level ii in Section 2 of this directive, as proposed by the regional intelligence groups.
- i. Review and establish a course of action for the payment of rewards in special cases or operations carried out in foreign countries, when proposed by different intelligence agencies of the Armed Forces or by the DAS.

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9. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR COORDINATION.

a. As indicated by the security situation, the President of the Republic and/or the Minister of National Defense may, at any time, modify the list of adherents of the illegal armed groups.

b. Resources to be used for the payment of rewards and payments for information.

i) The assigned budget for the payment of rewards established in sections 3 and 4 of this directive is the budget of the Ministry of Defense. Payments will be financed by government funds, and other funds from national and international economic cooperation. For that purpose, a budget classification 2-0-2-80-58, Payment of Rewards, has been activated in the SHF. Payments for information will be made by the budget classifications assigned by the intelligence directors of the armed forces.

ii) The Ministry of Defense will put aside an initial amount for each of the intelligence agencies.

iii) In case additional amounts are required, the armed forces and the DAS (Department of Security) shall make application to the Vice Minister for Administration, specifying the amount required. In the case of the Armed Forces, the Defense Ministry shall take the steps necessary to transfer the funds as quickly as possible. For other agencies, these funds shall be made part of the agreement with the Ministry of Defense for this purpose. The applicant shall attach a report differentiating the expense from the funds previously assigned.

iv) The funds available for the payment of rewards are independent of the funds set aside for other costs.

v) The Joint Activities Forces and the Joint Commands shall only apply to the J-2 of the Commanding General of the Armed Forces for funds for the payment of rewards and payment for information, following the procedures stipulated in this directive.

c. Approval of payment of rewards for leaders whose names are not found on the Level II list and for criminals at levels III, IV, or V.

i) Every intelligence agency shall create a central committee to approve reward payments, and shall verify those leaders whose names are not found on the list of leaders classified at level II, or in conformity with the agency's evaluation of intelligence, are classified at levels III, IV, or V.

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ii) In addition, for the payment of rewards for leaders at level II, there shall be attached a certification by the Regional Intelligence Group , establishing the level to which the killed or captured leader belongs.

iii) In special cases, and for payments of rewards for operations carried out outside the country, the agency involved shall take the case to the Technical Oversight Committee. That Committee shall determine the course of action.

d. When a source provides information to international agencies or entities in order to claim a reward for the capture or killing in combat of a leader, the amounts offered in this directive have no effect. The payment may only be made by those international agencies or entities.

10. REGULATORY CROSS-REFERENCES

The official document that shall serve as a basis or guide for the reclassification and updating of the list of leaders referred to in Section 3 of this directive shall be the most recent enemy countdown by the different intelligence agencies and coordinated by the intelligence headquarters and the C/I Unit of the Commanding General of the Armed Forces.

Every intelligence agency in the Armed Forces and in the National Police shall bring its rules, directives and manuals into conformity with the stipulations in this directive.
